General Information

The global trend of technological change has intensified the debate on market competition and regulatory reform. The hierarchical, interventionist command and control governance has been shifted towards a cooperative and post-regulatory state. A wide variety of regulatory instruments have been applied in market regulation, specifically in the fields of safety regulation, consumer protection, product liabilities, climate change, and environmental challenges. The aim of this seminar is to examine the use of 'smart mixes' between regulatory instruments at different levels of governance (at domestic or international level), different types of instruments (market-based instruments, ex-ante and ex-post regulation, and liability rules) and between public, private and self-regulation. By taking an economic and comparative perspective, the keynote speech of this seminar discusses how liability rules could be arranged under public law and in private law, and provides examples on how tort law liability could be taken as a complement to government regulation.
